Šaunštejn

The beautiful clifftop ruin of Šaunštejn (Schauenstein), 340 m above sea level, offers wonderful views of Vysoká Lípa, Bohemian Switzerland, and Růžovský vrch. The "bandits' lair," as it's known locally, is on the red trail between Vysoká Lípa and Malá pravčická brána. The ruin itself is accessed by a set of stairs set in a crack in the bluff with steel catwalks between viewing areas.

Pravčická brána

Pravčická Brána arch, Bohemian Switzerland's most famous rock formation, is even more impressive up close. Note: Due to damage by the forest fire in 2022, some routes to the arch may be temporarily closed. Keep an eye on the national park website for the latest.

Mariina vyhlídka

This clifftop viewpoint (428 m above sea level) is one of the most popular spots in the Jetřichovice cliffs. The little wood cabin perched at the top has a panoramic view of the woodlands, bluffs, and hills of Bohemian Switzerland and is open all year. To get there, hike the red trail from Jetřichovice. You can continue along the Jetřichovice cliffs to Vílemínina vyhlídka, Rudolfův kámen, and Pohovka and then head back to Jetřichovice on the green trail or to Vysoká Lípa on red.

Falkenštejn

This clifftop ruin from the turn of the 13th and 14th centuries is 2 km from Jetrichovice on the yellow trail. Climb its metal staircases, balance on its catwalks, and map out its rooms, the kitchen, and the well. If you're traveling with children, be sure to stop by Rynartice to see the dwarves in the cliff.




Stunning views

The area around Děčín, with its enchanting places, mysterious corners, and stunning views, is one of the most attractive destinations in the country. With Bohemian Switzerland National Park just around the corner and the majestic Elbe River running right through, visitors can experience unbeatable views of Europe's deepest sandstone canyon.

Pastýřská stěna

Don't miss the view from the terrace on Pastýřská stěna (Shepherds Bluff) in the heart of town. The small, castle-like bistro perched atop this 150-meter cliff is just above Děčín Zoo. The terrace is accessible by car, or hikers can take one of the footpaths leading to the top. The truly adventurous can scale the cliff on the *via ferrata*.

Sněžník

No visit to Děčín would be complete without seeing Děčínský Sněžník, one of the oldest observation towers in Bohemia. This tower on the highest flat-topped mountain in the country

has views of the Lusatian Mountains and Bohemian Switzerland. By car (from Děčín or Jílové) you can get within 1.5 km of the tower. There is a paid lot from which a paved trail leads up to the summit. At the top are a guesthouse and a buffet. The tower is open daily from April to October, on weekends November to March.

Růženka

This odd little tower (6.2 m) tops Pastevní vrch in the village of Růžová. Funded by local donors, it opened in April 2018. Visit Rubens soap workshop in the village, while you're here. From the village church a 4 km walk on the yellow trail takes you to nearby Janov, where there is another observation

tower next to a golf course.

Janov

Open year-round free of charge, this observation tower (347 m above sea level) stands at the edge of Janov, about 15 km north of Děčín. Hike the yellow trail from Hřensko along the Kamenice River and Wild Gorge (Divoká soutěska). The tower has a view of nearby villages, Děčínský Sněžník, the cliffs of Stříbrné stěny, Pravčická brána arch, Růžovský vrch, and parts of the Lusatian Mountains as well as the flat-topped mountains of Saxony.

Sokolí vrch

This observation tower (506 m above sea level) in the village of Dobrná offers views of Děčín, Děčínský Sněžník, the Ore and Lusatian Mountains, Říp mountain, Bezděz castle, and Ještěd. From the platform 162 steps up, you can see as far as the Giant Mountains and Sněžka on a clear day. The tower is open May through October daily except Mondays. Parking at the foot of the tower.

The ridge known as Quaderberg (Kvádrberk) looms over the right bank of the Elbe on the northern edge of Děčín. At its foot is a city park and at its top the Imperial terrace (289 m above sea level), which offers a fantastic view of the town. The obelisk (1879) honors the 25th wedding anniversary of Emperor Franz Joseph and Elisabeth of Bavaria. From here the red trail follows the canyon to Hřensko.

Belvedér

Belvedér observation terrace near Labská Stráň has a magnificent view of the Elbe River canyon. An arched niche at the back once

served as an outdoor stage an there is a hotel adjacent. The spot is accessible by car or by foot on the red trail, 5 km from Hřensko or 13 km from Děčín. Or take the ferry from Dolní Žleb and climb the old stone stairway to emerge at the top as if entering the past.



Velký Chlum

Follow the red hiking trail along the Elbe River and up to the stone observati-

on tower on Chlum. Along the way there are nice views of the landscape and there's a campfire at the foot of the tower. On a clear day, you can see south to the Central Bohemian Uplands, west to the Ore Mountians and Děčínský Sněžník, and north to Bohemian and Saxon Switzerland. The observation tower is accessible by car or on foot.
